






Climate Adaptation Research Lab!

Long-term monitoring has been established to:

 To look at rehabilitating historic land use that has made the area vulnerable to climate change

 To test restorative techniques that will protect the region from fire and drought





The Mt Maxwell Project aims:

 To develop strategies to improve and protect the island's drinking water and reduce fire risk.

• Increase our local capacity for climate resilience.

The project focuses on a trial area:

Where a community of practice can be established

 Where restorative techniques can be developed and applied in other Coastal Douglas-fir regions.












